In October 1986, Congress passed the Asbestos Hazard Emergency Response Act (AHERA) and required the establishment of procedures for public and private school districts to follow in response to asbestos containing materials in schools. As a result, all Colorado school districts were required to inspect their schools for the presence of asbestos containing materials and to develop and maintain asbestos management plans. This has been done as required.

The AHERA statute also requires the asbestos management plans be available for review and that parent and employee organizations be notified of their availability. The purpose of this letter is to provide the annual notification as required.

The Asbestos Management Plan is available in each school and is located in the school office. It is available for inspection during normal school hours. The plan is also available at the District Facilities office and is available for inspection, Monday through Friday, 6:30 a.m. to 3:00 p.m. The asbestos management plan describes where asbestos containing materials are located in the school and present recommendations for remediation (often by removal) or how the material is to be maintained. They also give a history of remediation efforts.
