# CO DEPARTMENT OF EDUCATION COMPREHENSIVE HEALTH GRANT

# **General information**

- Aimed at supporting comprehensive health education in Colorado school districts
- Awarded to District 11 in Summer of 2019
- \$28,500/year for three years

### Requirements of the grant

- 1. The district will submit a mid-year and end-of-year report to CDE and provide additional information upon request.
- 2. The district will create a health advisory council to support the grant.
- 3. The district will attend two, two-day training meetings.
- 4. Funds will be used to supplement and not supplant funds currently being used to provide health and wellness services to stuents.
- 5. Funded projects will maintain appropriate fiscal records and regular audits will be conducted.
- 6. If any misuse of these funds are discovered, funds will be returned to CDE
- 7. The grantee will maintain sole responsibility for the project event though subcontractors may be used to perform certain services.

# **D11 Year One Objectives**

- 1. Provide 4 days of professional development for teachers.
- 2. Develop and pilot three middle school health units.
- 3. Revise current middle school health units.
- 4. Conduct an analysis of the district's comprehensive health curriculum and programs.

#### What will the grant funds be used for? What doesn't the grant require? Approximately \$6000 will be used for The grant does not require districts to operating expenses, which include adopt new health curriculum. printing, supplies, materials, etc. needed to facilitate teacher training. The grant does not require districts to adopt new policies.
