Expressing support for designation of the week beginning on the second Sunday of September as Arts in Education Week

Whereas arts education, comprising a rich array of disciplines including dance, music, theatre, media arts, literature, design, and visual arts, is a core academic subject and an essential element of a complete and balanced education for all students; and

Whereas arts education enables students to develop critical thinking and problem solving skills, imagination and creativity, discipline and collaboration, alternative ways to communicate and express feelings and ideas, and cross-cultural understanding, which supports academic success across the curriculum as well as personal growth outside the classroom; and

Whereas to succeed in today's economy, students must masterfully use words, images, sounds, and movement to communicate; and

Whereas when schools and communities deliver high quality learning opportunities in, through, and about the arts for children, extraordinary results occur; and

Whereas arts education has a demonstrated ability to increase attendance rates, graduation rates, and student achievement, especially for at-risk students; and

Whereas attracting and retaining the best teachers is vital and can be achieved by ensuring that schools embrace the arts, becoming havens for creativity and innovation; and

Whereas there is widespread concern that high-stakes testing, accountability, and the new Colorado graduation requirements are leading to reductions in access to arts education for Colorado students; and

Whereas art is integral to the lives of United States citizens and essential to the health and vitality of communities and of the Nation:

Be It Resolved, that the Colorado Springs District 11 Board of Education reaffirms the importance of the arts as an essential part of a classic, well-rounded, strong academic education; and

Be It Further Resolved that the Board of Education supports the designation of September 8-14, 2013 as Arts in Education Week and calls on all District employees and families to observe the week with appropriate activities.
